ELIZABETH FORT

Elizabeth Fort is situated outside and to the south of the original walled city and is a fine example of a 17th century star-shaped fort. Originally built in 1601 during the reign of Elizabeth I. It was used as an army base for the protection of the city. It was demolished by the citizens of Cork in 1603, but they were compelled to rebuild it at their own expense.

It was replaced in 1624 by a stronger fort which had the same basic outline as that which survives today. It is reputed that improvements were also made by Cromwell in 1649 when he laid siege to the city. It was used again in 1690 by Williamite forces to shell the city and a cannonball fired from the Fort at the old tower of St. Fin Barre's was found during the 19th century rebuilding of the Cathedral and can be seen hanging in the new Cathedral.

In 1719, Elizabeth Fort became a British military barracks and housed approximately seven hundred men. In 1806, a 'New Barracks' was built on the north side of the city (now called Collins Barracks), and Elizabeth fort was converted to a Female Convict Prison. It subsequently became home to various bodies such as a station for the Cork City Artillery Militia. During the Irish War of Independence (1920-21), it was occupied by the Royal Irish Constabulary and duly handed over to the Provisional Irish Government at the end of the war. It was a Garda Station until very recently, and to this day remains one of Cork's most historic gems. Never been excavated, Elizabeth Fort has a wealth of stories waiting to be discovered.


The show will feature live performances from young adults, junior and teenage rappers and singers in The Kabin Crew as they find creative ways to express themselves through Hip Hop.

We aim to support a diverse range of artists at all stages of their careers.

We strive to present art for everyone, for audiences young and old, from all communities and backgrounds.

We produce theatre which responds to the world around it, yet remains rooted in Cork. We remain committed to the artistic future of our city and county, creating training and opportunities for children, young people, emerging artists and communities.

The Everyman is your local theatre, wherever you are. Our beautiful 650-seat theatre is a jewel of late Victorian architecture. The building is steeped in history and the auditorium is a favourite with audiences and performers alike for its intimacy and atmosphere. We have developed a large digital reach internationally, all created through the conduit of our stage here in Cork. We can't wait to bring audiences back in person to the building. It misses you.

In October 2020, The Everyman adapted to the new experience of digital performance and launched *Play It by Ear*, a programme of live performance from The Everyman stage and audio streamed to audiences locally and globally. This new digital direction encompassed video streamed live and pre-recorded performance from December 2020. In January 2021, *How It Is (Part 3), by Samuel Beckett - A Digital Preview* was presented by Gare St Lazare and The Coronet Theatre in association with The Everyman. In spring 2021, we launched *Behind the Curtain*, a collaboration with Islander welcoming audiences behind the curtains of our city's heartlands of music via live video stream. Most recently, our co-production of *To the Lighthouse* by Virginia Woolf, filmed from The Everyman stage, received raving reviews when it was premiered as part of Cork Midsummer Festival 2021.

Previous highlights include a co-production of the world premiere of *Evening Train* (2019), a new musical which received a phenomenal audience reaction. The same year saw the return of our co-production of *Asking For It* with Landmark Productions in association with the Abbey Theatre and Cork Midsummer Festival (Irish Times Audience Choice Award 2018), which then toured to the Gaiety (2019) and Birmingham Rep (2020). 2018 saw a national tour of *Autumn Royal*, a brand-new production of Martin McDonagh's *The Lonesome West* and the world premiere of *The Nightingale and the Rose*, a new opera by John O'Brien based on Oscar Wilde's timeless story.
